Jonas Kaufmann is the most sought-after and most appreciated tenor of today. He presents himself to the Slovak audience for the first time accompanied by the Slovak Philharmonic. The native of Munich shines on the biggest and most famous opera stages. The most known characters this opera superstar portrayed are Otello, Don José from Carmen, Mario Cavaradossi from Tosca, or Parsifal from Wagner's opera Parsifal.

Jonas Kaufmann

Hailed as "the world's greatest tenor" by The Telegraph, Jonas Kaufmann has performed over 70 roles in the world's leading opera houses. The New York Times has described him as having "clarion top notes, the blend of virility and tenderness in his singing," and praised his "refined musicianship." Not only a great vocal technician, his performances are also praised for their dramatic impact, "He embodies each role with such an investment that he makes the viewer think that this is the last time he will perform this work." (Telerama). One of today's greatest interpreters of Lieder repertoire, Kaufmann is also in very high demand in concert. His performances and recording have earned him multiple honors and awards including eleven ECHO/OPUS Klassik awards, "Singer of the Year" from multiple classical music magazines including Opernwelt, Diapason and Musical America. He has been knighted as a Chevalier de l'Ordre de l'Art et des Lettres, and has been named a member of the Bayerischer Maximiliansorden. In 2022 he was appointed Austrian Kammersänger, in 2024 he received the Ordre de la Légion d'honneur.

At the beginning of the 2023/24 season, Jonas Kaufmann presented a special project with Helmut Deutsch and director Claus Guth at the Park Avenue Armory in New York: Doppelgänger, a staged interpretation of Schubert's Schwanengesang. This was followed by an Otello series and a new production of Turandot at the Vienna State Opera, end-of-year concerts with the Berlin Philharmonic under Kirill Petrenko, a series of concerts with film classics (The Sound of Movies) in Baden-Baden, Prague, Naples and Wiesbaden, new productions of La Gioconda at the Salzburg Easter Festival and at the Teatro San Carlo in Naples, performances of Aida and Tosca at the Bavarian State Opera and Andrea Chenier at the Royal Opera House, as well as concert performances of Act 2 of Tristan und Isolde in Gstaad and Baden-Baden.

Since September 2024 Jonas Kaufmann is Director of the Tyrolean Festival Erl. To mark the 100th anniversary of Giacomo Puccini's death, he undertook a concert tour in Europe in October and November 2024, while also taking part in the Puccini Gala at Teatro alla Scala on November 29th.

2025 started with a revival of Leoncavallo's I Pagliacci at the Wiener Staatsoper, followed by an Asia tour with opera concerts and recitals, a recital tour with Diana Damrau and Helmut Deutsch (songs by Mahler and Strauss), the title role in Parsifal at the Erl Festival and a new production of I Pagliacci at the Bavarian State Opera.

A voice which excels in a large variety of repertoire, Kaufmann has received recognition for his performance of French, German and Italian roles, as well as his performance in recital. Standout roles include Don José, Werther, Don Carlo, Otello, Andrea Chenier, Maurizio, Lohengrin, Parsifal and Florestan, which he has performed at houses such as Teatro alla Scala, Covent Garden, the Bayerische Staatsoper, the Metropolitan Opera, Opernhaus Zürich, Opéra national de Paris, and the Wiener Staatsoper. He has released multiple recordings, also encompassing diverse repertoire, including operatic repertoire, Lieder, operetta, and more.

A native of Munich, Germany, Jonas Kaufmann completed his vocal studies there at the Hochschule für Musik und Theater München, in addition to which he attended master classes with Hans Hotter, James King and Josef Metternich. During his first years on stage at the State Theatre in Saarbrücken he continued his training with Michael Rhodes in Trier.



Jochen Rieder

Teatro alla Scala, Carnegie Hall and Frankfurt's Alte Oper – Jochen Rieder is a regular guest in many of the world's leading opera houses and concert halls, collaborating with some of today's most admired soloists and orchestra.

An enthusiastic artist widely recognized especially for his work with German and Italian repertoire, Maestro Rieder has lead critically acclaimed performances and CD productions across the world.

Regular collaborations include some of the greatest singers of our time, such as Peter Seiffert, Waltraud Meier, Leo Nucci, Agnes Baltsa, Jonas Kaufmann, Renée Fleming, Nina Stemme, Thomas Hampson, José van Dam, Matthias Goerne, Matti Salminen and Michael Volle.

Over the years, a long and intense musical partnership has become established with tenor Jonas Kaufmann. Together, they have performed at the Royal Festival Hall in London, the Barbican Centre, the Philharmonie of Berlin, Laeiszhalle Hamburg, Philharmonie of Munich, the Stuttgart Liederhalle, Baden-Baden's Festspielhaus, Vienna's Konzerthaus, the KKL Lucerne, the Théâtre des Champs-Elysées in Paris, Essen Philharmonic Hall, Palais des Beaux-Arts in Brussels, Peralada Festival, Seoul Arts Center in South Korea, Menuhin-Festival Gstaad/CH, the Royal Opera House Muscat/Oman, the Konzerthaus Dortmund, the Alte Oper Frankfurt, the Sydney Opera House/Australia, the Movistar

Arena Santiago de Chile/South America, Teatro Real Madrid, Schlossfestspiele Regensburg, the Tchaikovsky Conservatory Moscow, the Concertgebouw Amsterdam, the Osaka Festival Hall, the Suntory-Hall Tokyo, the Waldbühne Berlin, the Schleswig-Holstein Music Festival, the Carnegie Hall New York, the Elbphilharmonie Hamburg, the Arena di Verona, as well as in Hong Kong and Taipei.

He conducts numerous renowned orchestras, including the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra, Orchestra Filarmonica della Scala Milano, London Philharmonic Orchestra, Rundfunk-Sinfonie-Orchester Berlin, Bruckner Orchestra Linz, RAI Symphony Orchestra, Prague Symphony Orchestra, Residentie Orkest The Hague and BBC Symphony Orchestra.

Besides concerts all over the world, they made several recordings together, released by SONY: 2014 with the Rundfunk-Sinfonieorchester Berlin CD and DVD with Operette-Arias (awarded with Platinum and Gold and the «Echo-Klassik 2015»), 2015 the DVD of the Puccini-concert at the Teatro alla Scala in Milan, which has also been screened in many cinemas, 2016 the DVD «Dolce Vita – My Italy», accompanied by the Orchestra Sinfonica Nazionale della RAI di Torino and 2018 CD and DVD «An italian night», from the Waldbühne Berlin, again with the Rundfunk-Sinfonieorchester Berlin and awarded with the OPUS KI ASSIK 2019.

Further recordings have been in 2020 "Mein Wien" (SONY Classical) with Jonas Kaufmann and Rachel Willis Sorensen, "It's Christmas" (SONY Classical) with Jonas Kaufmann and the Mozarteum Orchester Salzburg, The Sound Of Movies" (SONY Classical) with Jonas Kaufmann and the Czech National Symphony Orchestra as well as a recording released in 2015 by NAXOS, containing Mahler's orchestral songs with Swedish baritone Peter Mattei and the Norrköping Symphony Orchestra and the recording "Arias for Josepha" (SONY Classical) with Sarah Traubel and the Prague Philharmonia.

In 2024 the Deutsche Grammophon has released the OPUS KLASSIK awarded Recording "Breathe" with Hera Hyesang Park and the Orchestra del Teatro Carlo Felice.

Conductor Jochen Rieder was born in the German region of Rhineland-Palatinate. He has followed a classic Kapellmeister career path that has taken him from conducting positions in Karlsruhe via Bremen to the Zürich Opera House.

The Slovak Philharmonic Orchestra

was established in 1949. Two internationally reputed personalities, V. Talich (1949 - 1952) and L. Rajter (1949 - 1976) stood at the orchestra's birth. Other chief conductors who have played an important role in the orchestra's musical evolution include T. Frešo, L. Slovák, L. Pešek, V. Verbickij, B. Režucha, A. Ceccato, O. Lenárd, J. Bělohlávek, V. Válek, P. Feranec, E. Villaume, J. Judd and D. Raiskin (2020 – 2025). In the season of 2025/2026, Daniel Raiskin and Ondrej Olos are going to perform with the philharmonic as its permanent guest conductors. Among the many guest conductors who have worked with the Slovak Philharmonic over the years, international personalities like J. Ferencsik, W. Rowicki, V. Smetáček, K. Ančerl, F. Konwitschny, A. Jansons, V. Neumann, H. Abendroth, A. Pedrotti, Sir E. Goossens, Sir M. Sargent, R. Benzi, K. Masur, Sir Ch. Mackerras, C. Zecchi, S. Baudo, C. Abbado, K. Sanderling, Z. Košler, R. Muti, K. Richter, K. Kondrašin, L. Segerstam, A. Lombard, S. Celibidache, T. Sanderling, O. Danon, M. Rossi, N. Järvi, K. Kobayashi, J. Svetlanov, M. Jansons, Ch. von Dohnányi, D. Kitajenko, O. Suitner, J. Conlon, V. Gergiev, A. Rahbari, F. Luisi, Sir Y. Menuhin, P. Schreier, V. Fedosejev, R. Weikert, M. Caridis, P. Steinberg, P. Keuschnig, T. Hanus, J. Hrůša, J. Valčuha, T. Netopil, I. Marin, P. Baleff, G. Pehlivanian, J. Märkl, I. Volkov, W. Marshall, E. G. Jensen, A. Buribayev must be mentioned, as well as composers and performers of self-penned works like J. Martinon, K. Penderecki and A. Khachaturian. The orchestra has made numerous recordings for radio, television and music publishers OPUS, Supraphon, Panton, Hungaroton, JVC Victor, RCA, Pacific Music, Naxos and Marco Polo. The Slovak Philharmonic Orchestra regularly gives guest performances on leading European stages and festivals, as well as in Cyprus, Turkey, and the USA, and they regularly have concert tours in Japan, South Korea, Oman and United Arab Emirates. In recent years, the Slovak Philharmonic Orchestra toured Japan and South Korea, performed in Murten (Switzerland) as well as on prestigious stages such as that of Stuttgart's Liederhalle and the Cologne Philharmonic. Furthermore, it has held its concerts in Zagreb, Maribor, St. Stephen's Cathedral in Vienna, and on the Krumlov Festival with Maxim Vengerov. In the season of 2025/2026, the orchestra continues its work on the recordings of F. Schmidt's symphonies in collaboration with its permanent quest conductor, D. Raiskin. The orchestra has accepted invitations to concerts at the Festspielhaus cycle in Salzburg, the Lednice-Valtice Music Festival and at local festivals, Allegretto Žilina and Košice Music Spring Festival. In terms of international tours in the 2025/2026 season, the Slovak Philharmonic is planning to tour Spain, Japan and Portugal, performing with several soloists, including M. Mimica (bass-baritone). A. Conunova (violin) and N. Rodiles, A. Gorlatch, O. Scheps, R. da Costa and M. João Pires (piano).

- In case of later arrival after the start of the event, you will be seated during the applause to the available seats so to avoid disturbance of other visitors

DURING THE CONCERT


- out of respect for the artists and other visitors, please avoid of all disturbing sounds such as ringing phones, rustling, talking, whispering, etc.
